







Now these would not appear to be the most inspirational verses in the Old Testament but the insight that she brought while working her way through the list was very exciting and surprising.

So, what is it that makes a verse from the Bible stand out as important,

special, or precious to us? For me it is usually something that I read during a time when I am asking the Lord questions, or seeking enlightenment about something. Sometimes it might just be the light going on to illuminate something I have wondered about for ages or a new clarity that I never saw coming.

It is interesting how puzzlement about something in the Bible can linger around for years until the Holy Spirit intervenes. Then we wonder how on earth we went for so long without understanding that it is so simple. Perhaps this is what makes those scriptures so



precious. It is the intimacy of the Holy Spirit coming close to little me and taking time to show me something wonderful about Himself. It is the memory of that moment when the clouds parted and the light got through.

Without the help of the Holy Spirit, we can all become brilliant exponents of the contents of the Bible, But with Him we enter into the wonder of what really lies between the covers.

Important Bible Verses That Have Meaning For Me *From Sandie B.*

The focus for this month's magazine is Precious Scriptures. However, being asked to give one scripture I find to be extremely difficult. All scriptures are precious.

In short, Christians know the scriptures are God's Word because in them



they hear the voice of their Lord. As Jesus declared,

"My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me" (John 10: 27).

Over the years I have found myself turning to the following scriptures for solace, inspiration and to

help others. For me it has to begin with Psalm 139: 1-18. Particularly verses 13 and 14. You made all the delicate, inner parts of my body and knit me together in my mother's womb. Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex!

Your workmanship is marvellous - and how well I know it.

Each of us is unique and special ... embraced and accepted by God himself ... even though not one of us is perfect.

In Numbers 6: 24-26 the simple words of this blessing reflect God's desire for all his people.

'May the Lord bless you and protect you. May the Lord smile on you and be gracious to you. May the Lord show you his favour and give you his peace.'

In Isaiah 40: 29-31 I know that I will be able to seek God and wait on him to complete his work in my life and I will be continually renewed. He gives power to those who are tired and worn out; he offers strength to the weak. Even youths will become exhausted, and young men will give up. But those who wait on the Lord will find new strength. They will fly high on the wings of eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not grow faint.

I am not fortunate to see eagles flying where I live but I do see red kites ... and they often remind me of these verses as they circle in the sky with their beautiful wings glistening in the sun.



For I know the plans I have for you," says the Lord. "They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope. Jeremiah 29: 11

This verse is one that has help me throughout my life and one I frequently pass onto others.

In the Bible we have the Commandments and the Lord's Prayer but I have felt happier reading the Beatitudes. The Beatitudes contain much of what God desires of us as we seek to follow his will for our lives.

"God blesses those who realise their need for him, for the Kingdom of Heaven is given to them. God blesses those who mourn, for they will be comforted. God blesses those who are gentle and lowly, for the whole earth will belong to them. God blesses those who are hungry and thirsty for justice. for they will receive it in full. God blesses those who are merciful for they will be shown mercy. God blesses those whose hearts are pure, for they will see God. God blesses those who work for peace, for they will be called the children of God God blesses those who are persecuted because they live for God, for the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs. Matthew 5: 3-10

Finally I have my last scriptures from 1 Corinthians 13: 4-8 and verse 13.

There are three things that will endure - faith, hope, and love and the greatest of these is love.

Because where would we be if we didn't love one another.

He Rescued Me

Many years ago, I was going through a destructive crisis in my life and the lives of my children. Every day seemed like an eternity of pain and emotional disruption as we tried to survive, financially, practically and in faith. It had been brought about by the actions of someone else and my inability to see it coming and do something about it.

I was a young Christian, only into faith by a couple of years but I was thirsty for God and for His word. Night after night, when the children were in bed, I scoured the Bible for instruction or assistance and I prayed for my family, literally on my face, almost in desperation. I had been told that God was my father and I determined to apply that truth to my situation as I appealed to Him for help. He was not slow in answering me.

One evening I was reading the Psalms and that thing that many of us have experienced happened. The words of Psalm 40 leapt off the page and into my spirit.

I waited patiently for the Lord, He turned to me and heard my cry. He lifted me out of the slimy pit, Out of the mud and mire, He set my feet on a rock And gave me a firm place to stand. He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God.

It was weird; as though the words of the Psalm were burning into me and I literally heard a voice within me telling me that this was for me and I should take it and live in it. I went to sleep and, as though to prove to me that the message was true, I woke the next morning singing praises to God.

For several weeks after that, new songs began to form in my mind. One day our minister came to me and asked if I had a song that I could sing in the service on the following Sunday. I hadn't told him about what had happened. Yes, I did have a song. It was one that no one had heard before. I was blessed to have a minister who was in tune with God because that could be the only explanation.

The situation we were in did not change. In fact, elements of it tried to attack us in different ways for many years but I was now equipped the better to deal with things as they arose. Our financial situation eased a little and we got by, never once going into the red. Whenever we had a deep need God met it through the love and obedience of my fellow believers and even some friends who were not Christians but suddenly thought we 'might need this!'

Psalm 40 is one of my most precious scriptures. Yes, it is a word of hope but it is much more than that because God took it and used it for my rescue. He rescued me.

running up to 23rd.


During our Sunday Service on 25th June there will be mention of the celebrations and thanksgiving for all the Windrush generation and their families have contributed to our culture and development.

Our Moderator has not been idle




Synod News reported.....
